6	ABOUT THE EVENT/ ACTIVITY (in max 200 words)	<p>SSSDC participated in the North India Skill Summit on 28 April 2017 organized by FICCI at National Institute of Technical Teachers Training & Research (NITTTR) in Chandigarh. The summit was based on an initiative taken towards Sustainable Skilling India. On behalf of SSSDC, Ms. Gloria Joseph, Manager Projects attended the Summit.</p> <p>Many prominent officials from Universities, State Skill Development Missions (SSDMs) from HP, Haryana and Punjab, a representative from Japan, NSDA, NSDC, CSR Companies, VTPs and Sector Skill Councils attended the summit including professors and students.</p> <p>Many issues and challenges faced by VTPs, SSCs, CSR companies and SSDMs were openly discussed during the summit. A brief is given below :</p> <p><u>SSDMs :</u></p>

		<p>1. SSDM presented their views on the role played by them in skilling in their respective states. They reiterated that SSCs should take more interest and handhold the VTPs during the training, completion of assessments and certification.</p> <p>2. Mr Ashok Prachar wanted the curriculum in local languages should be printed by the SSCs for easy reference by the students but the panel endorsed that it is the state's responsibility to translate the curriculum into their local languages.</p> <p><u>SSC:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Due to shortage of time, some SSCs were allotted a few minutes to present about their company, their achievements, their role in society, the numbers they have got this year etc 2. However during the brainstorming many SSCs pointed out the challenges faced by them, one major issue - there is disconnect between SSDMs and the SSCs with no single SPOC to attend to the issues. This point was taken into account and it was confirmed that SPOC details will be shared with SSCs. <p><u>GENERAL :</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The university officials shared that they are not kept in the loop on the NSQF project held in schools which was found to be a big gap. 2. It was pointed out that SSCs should have new QPs introduced into the system. 3. University certification should be introduced into the system. 4. It was suggested to develop a link for networking between state skill missions, training partners and SSCs. 5. RPL - To understand the mechanism of carrying out the assessments of RPL at training centers. 6. Dr R K Sharma, HP talked elaborately on Demographic Dividend and how to achieve it in the skill development in the country. He also focused on Skilling India through higher education. 7. A common platform should be created where all the stakeholders can meet, discuss and resolve the challenges being faced by them from time to time . 8. CSR – Though CSR has been advancing rapidly, the awareness level is so low and due to lack of transparency and community participation, there are many challenges. This can be alleviated through companies looking beyond the traditional
